

## Key Action 1 - Mobility for learners and staff – Higher Education Student and Staff Mobility

# Inter-institutional<sup>1</sup> agreement 2017-2019<sup>2</sup> between institutions from Programme and Partner Countries<sup>3</sup>

### Minimum requirements<sup>4</sup>

The institutions named below agree to cooperate for the exchange of students and/or staff in the context of the Erasmus+ programme. They commit to respect the quality requirements of the Erasmus Charter for Higher Education in all aspects of the organisation and management of the mobility, in particular the recognition of the credits (or equivalent) awarded to students by the partner institution. The institutions also commit to sound and transparent management of funds allocated to them through Erasmus+.






The higher education institution agrees to:

- Respect in full the principles of non-discrimination and to promote and ensure equal access and opportunities to mobile participants from all backgrounds, in particular disadvantaged or vulnerable groups.
- Apply a selection process that is fair, transparent and documented, ensuring equal opportunities to participants eligible for mobility.
- Ensure recognition for satisfactorily completed activities of study mobility and, where possible, traineeships of its mobile students.
- Charge no fees, in the case of credit mobility, to incoming students for tuition, registration, examinations or access to laboratory and library facilities. Nevertheless, they may be charged small fees on the same basis as local students for costs such as insurance, student unions and the use of miscellaneous material.

The higher education institution located in a Partner Country of Erasmus+ further undertakes to:

#### Before mobility

- Provide information on courses (content, level, scope, language) well in advance of the mobility periods, so as to be transparent to all parties and allow mobile students to make well-informed choices about the courses they will follow.
- Ensure that outbound mobile participants are well prepared for the mobility, including having attained the necessary level of linguistic proficiency.
- Ensure that student and staff mobility for education or training purposes is based on a learning agreement for students and a mobility agreement for staff validated in advance between the sending and receiving institutions or enterprises and the mobile participants.
- Provide assistance related to obtaining visas, when required, for incoming and outbound mobile participants. Costs for visas can be covered with the mobility grants. See the information / visa section for contact details.
- Provide assistance related to obtaining insurance, when required, for incoming and outbound
  mobile participants. The institution from the Partner Country should inform mobile participants of
  cases in which insurance cover is not automatically provided. Costs for insurance can be
  covered with the organisational support grants. See the information / insurance section for
  contact details.
- Provide guidance to incoming mobile participants in finding accommodation. See the information /



housing section for contact details.

#### During and after mobility

- Ensure equal academic treatment and services for home students and staff and incoming mobile
  participants and integrate incoming mobile participants into the institution's everyday life, and
  have in place appropriate mentoring and support arrangements for mobile participants as well as
  appropriate linguistic support to incoming mobile participants.
- Accept all activities indicated in the learning agreement as counting towards the degree, provided these have been satisfactorily completed by the mobile student.
- Provide, free-of-charge, incoming mobile students and their sending institutions with transcripts in English or in the language of the sending institution containing a full, accurate and timely record of their achievements at the end of their mobility period.
- Support the reintegration of mobile participants and give them the opportunity, upon return, to build on their experiences for the benefit of the Institution and their peers.
- Ensure that staff are given recognition for their teaching and training activities undertaken during the mobility period, based on a mobility agreement.

#### E. Additional requirements

#### Selection requirements

Selection of staff and students in both institutions will be performed by panels formed of staff in each institution plus the Project Coordinator. The selection will be relevant to the area of Data Science and to the planned developments proposed in the text of the Erasmus Project that was approved for funding.

Selection of Goldsmiths participants will be made using an application form and in some cases an interview. Applicants will be reviewed by a panel and assessed on their academic standing and attendance, motivation for the placement and relevance to their studies or work.

Students' selection at TSU is based on the following criteria:

- 1. Language Proficiency (depends on languages of instruction at a Receiving Institution)
- 2. Academic Performance
- 3. Recommendation from the Faculty
- 4. Motivation
- 5. Student's Portfolio

Students whose level of foreign language is lower than B1, GPA is lower than 4.0 out of 5 or who don't have recommendation letter from their Faculty are not allowed to take part in the selection procedure. Candidates are selected by special Committee.

#### Pre-departure support

#### Goldsmiths

The International Mobility team will support with the Erasmus paperwork prior to departure and will deliver a pre-departure briefing for outgoing students. The Learning Agreements for student exchange will be signed by the Erasmus Academic Coordinator in each academic department.

Tomsk State University: Centre for joint academic programmes provides undergraduate and postgraduate students with assistance on all issues related to long-term academic mobility.



#### Arrival, Induction and Support

Goldsmiths

Goldsmiths will host an induction at the start of the autumn and spring terms to welcome new students and to give them the information required to support them during their stay. The International Mobility team and the departmental Erasmus Academic Coordinator will support students during their time at Goldsmiths.



- 1. Nominations for students participating in the exchange should be sent to the Goldsmiths International Mobility team at least two months prior to the proposed departure date to allow for the supporting paperwork to be processed.
- 2. Where relevant, a Transcript of Records will be issued by the receiving institution no later than 12 weeks after the assessment period has finished at the receiving HEI.
- 3. Termination of the agreement

This agreement is for the academic period 2017/18 – 2018/19.

This Collaboration Agreement may be terminated on the following grounds:

- End of stipulated period of validity.
- Mutual agreement between the parties.
- Written notice of termination with 6 months in advance, provided the termination shall not become effective until the end of the stay of the students enrolled in both institutions on the date of notification.

**European Credit Transfer Scheme (ECTS)** 


All courses and programmes at Goldsmiths are validated on the basis of one Goldsmiths' credit being equivalent to 0.5 ECTS. 
